 Preschool children (0-5 years old) work on this challenge with family members, caregivers, teachers, and librarians.

• It can be done! Read 3 books to your child each day; you will have read 1,095 books in one year. If you read one book a day, you can be done in less than 3 years.

 Record a favorite book as many times as it is read. Repetition is key to learning.

Count books read to your child by anyone, including grandparents, siblings, caregivers, and librarians. Did you attend Storytime at the library? Count those!

Sharing a book can include talking about the pictures, reading from cover to cover, or any other way of interacting with the book that works for you and your child.
