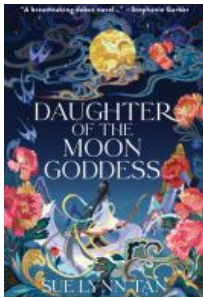


Gods of Jade and Shadow

The Mayan god of death sends a young woman on a harrowing, life-changing journey in this dark, one-of-a-kind fairy tale inspired by Mexican folklore.



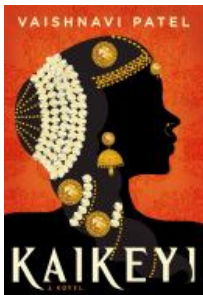
Daughter of the Moon Goddess

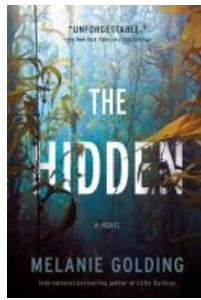
Black Water Sister

Twins imbued with incredible magic and near immortality will do anything to keep their family safe — even if it tears the siblings apart.



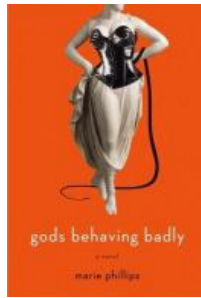
Kaikeyi: A Novel

Kaikeyi reimagines the life of the infamous queen from the Indian epic the Ramayana, weaving a tale of fate, family, courage and heartbreak.



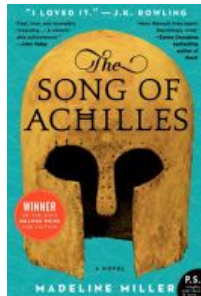
The Hidden

The 12 Greek gods of Olympus are alive and well in the 21st century, but they are crammed together in a London town house — and are none too happy about it. And their powers are waning.

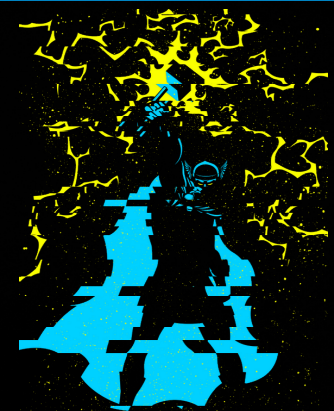


The Song of Achilles
by Madeleine Miller

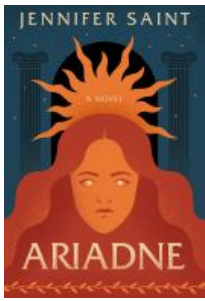

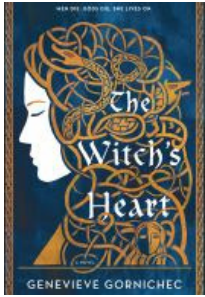
The First Girl Child

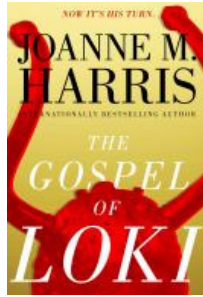
The Bear And The Nightingale

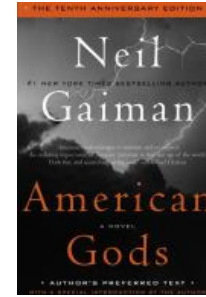
The Witch's Heart

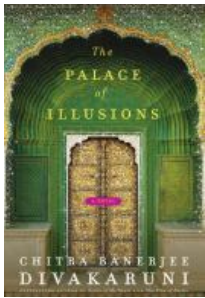
The Gospel of Loki

Upon his release from prison, a widower accepts a job as a bodyguard and joins the battle between the gods of yore and the neoteric gods of present-day America.



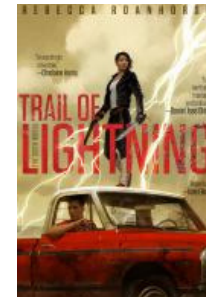
The Palace of Illusions

Taking us back to a time that is half history, half myth and wholly magical, this novel gives new voice to Panchaali, the heroine of the Mahabharat.



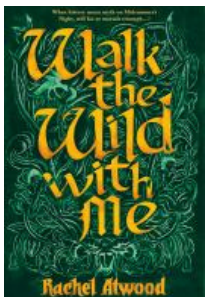
Servant of the Underworld

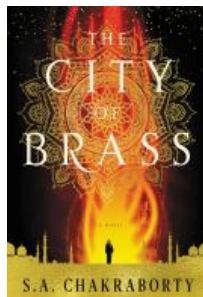
Trail of Lightning
