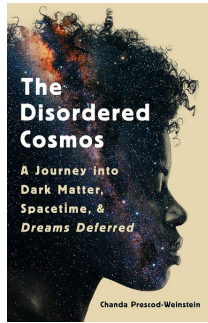


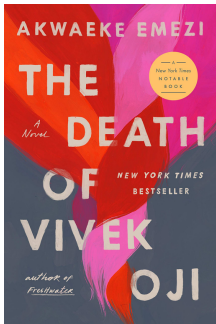
The Stone Loves the World

Two estranged parents must come together on a journey to find their missing daughter.



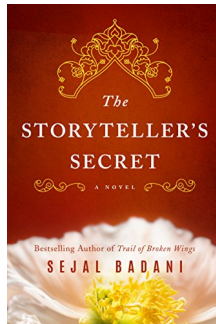
The Disordered Cosmos

Dr. Prescod-Weinstein shares her thoughts on her favorite physics topics, as well as her experiences as a black woman in the field of study.



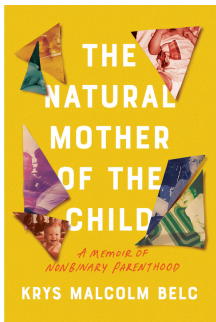
The Death of Vivek Oji

A family of four is on a rural vacation when news of nearby urban blackouts causes them to worry over their safety and the truthfulness of their hosts.



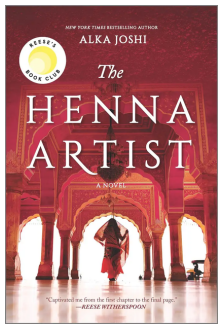
Love in Color

A collection of reimagined mythical love stories based on folktales from West Africa, Greece, India and the Middle East.



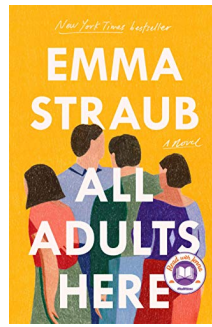

Lakshmi becomes a henna artist for a group of wealthy women in 1950s Jaipur when her abusive husband finds her and threatens everything she's built.



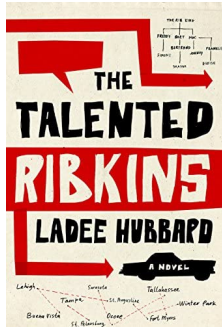
All Adults Here

A book of poetry that explores how to live enthusiastically with full knowledge of life's shortcomings.



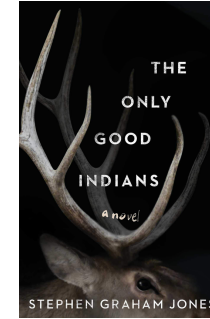
The Talented Ribkins

Johnny has one week to dig up all the stolen treasures he's hidden in Florida. Luckily, he's aided by his and his niece's strange superpowers.



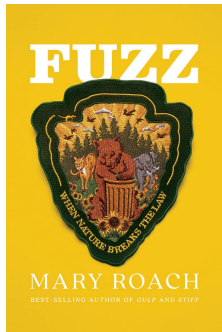
The Coldest Warrior

In 1975, Jack Gabriel's last CIA mission before retirement goes awry when he realizes his coworkers might be implicated in a murder.



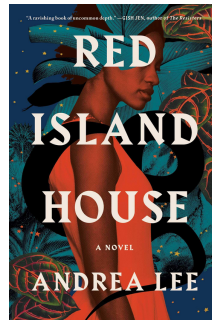
The Only Good Indians

A witty, well-researched book about human-wildlife conflict, covering topics such as politics, climate change and religion.



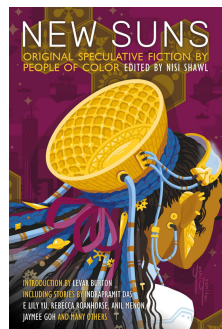
Red Island House

Shay, a black woman, struggles with her privileged American upbringing after she moves to her dream home in Madagascar.



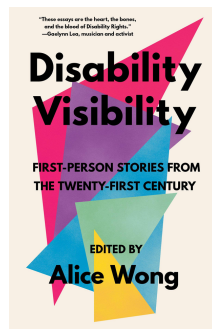
Last Tang Standing

Andrea Tang's career is blossoming, but her traditional Chinese-Malaysian family doesn't approve of her single status.



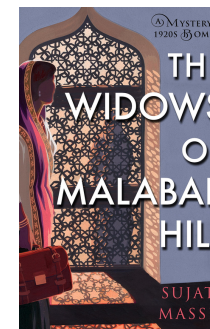
New Suns: Original Speculative Fiction by People of Color
